



Our mobiles are incredibly light, mechanically sophisticated, and highly responsive.

Perfect balance, precision tolerances, and incredibly low friction provide peaceful and continual geometric shifts.

Rigorously tested and proven, they present a mesmerizing array of color and movement. Like an indoor ocean of color, they are beautifully consistent, yet ever-changing.









Brush marks are layered to produce rich color-filled surfaces that change dramatically as the light shifts.




Every aspect is considered, designed and hand manufactured in our Florida studio—Allowing us a level of control and precision unparalleled by other artists working at this scale.
